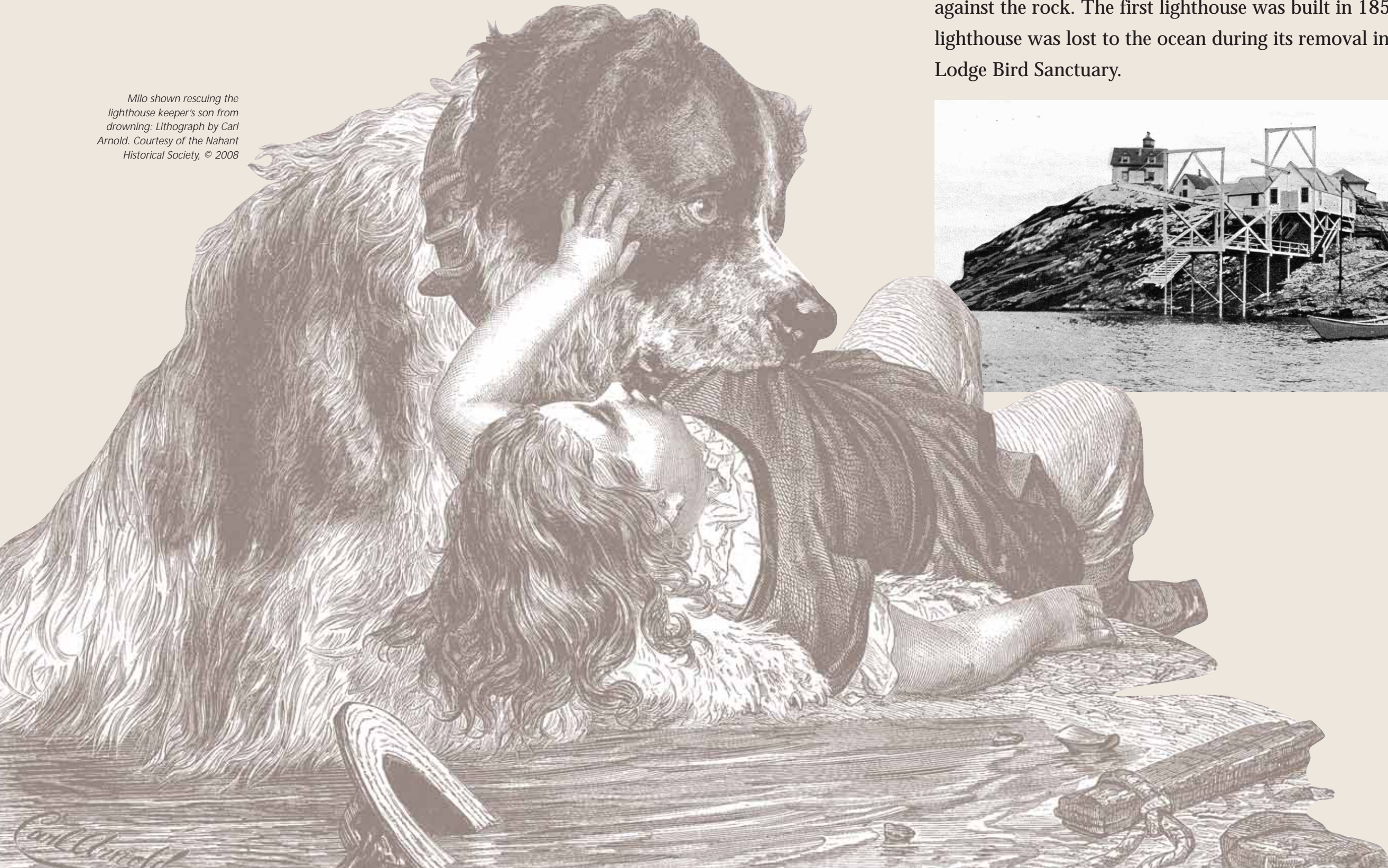


Egg Rock to the Rescue

Milo was a huge Newfoundland-Saint Bernard mix belonging to George B. Taylor, the first lighthouse keeper of Egg Rock. Milo was popularized in the national press for his heroic rescues of children. In foggy weather, Milo would bark at approaching vessels, saving them from crashing against the rock. The first lighthouse was built in 1856. Unfortunately, the second and last lighthouse was lost to the ocean during its removal in 1922. Today Egg Rock is the Henry Cabot Lodge Bird Sanctuary.
